CURRENT PROFESSIONAL PROFILE

I currently work as a Band 8a advanced physiotherapy practitioner / Independent physiotherapy prescriber and clinical lead in women's health, men's health and pelvic health rehabilitation at Hampshire and IOW Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust. My clinical case load includes adult male and female clients with various types of urinary and faecal incontinence, bowel evacuatory disorders, constipation, pelvic organ prolapse, pelvic floor muscle overactivity and antenatal patients with musculoskeletal dysfunction. When necessary, I use adjunctive treatments such as manual and myofascial techniques, point of care ultrasound (POCUS), EMG biofeedback and neuromuscular electrical stimulation to optimize treatment outcomes. In addition to this, I am an independent physiotherapy prescriber and prescribe certain medications to complement conservative management of these clients.

I am an active member of the urogynaecology, colorectal, perineal trauma clinic and vulva dermatology multidisciplinary teams in Portsmouth. I am engaged in an ongoing project and working closely with the local clinical commissioning group to improve clinical pathway for clients presenting with pelvic floor dysfunction. I receive referrals from the gastroenterology team, although I am yet to be involved in the multidisciplinary team meetings.

I was an active member of the education sub-committee of The Pelvic, Obstetric, & Gynaecological Physiotherapy (POGP) until September 2024, a specialist interest group of The Chartered Society of Physiotherapy. I took special interest in developing the portfolio process to for membership of the society. I am currently a tutor on the POGP female urinary dysfunction workshop. I am keen to support the development of pelvic health physiotherapy specialty, and when necessary, I mentor and offer student placement to post-graduate students enrolled on the University of Bradford continence programme.

I consider myself to be a quick and eager learner, focused and self-motivated clinician with diverse experience, using evidence-based treatments in a range of client-centered environment. I am enthusiastic and passionate about developing future pelvic health specialist physiotherapists and pelvic health facilities.
